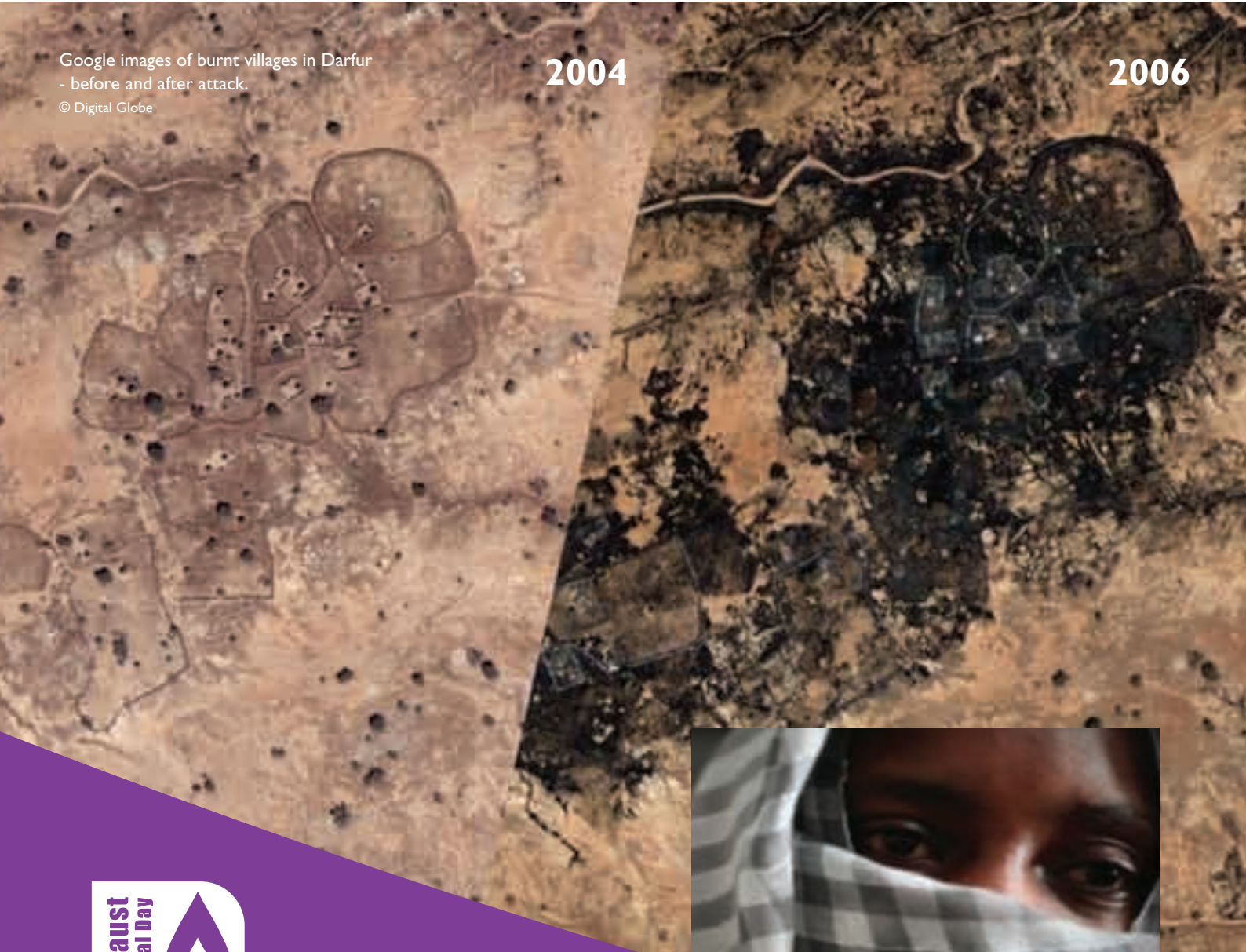

Genocide in our time: Darfur

Between 2003 and 2005, against a backdrop of civil war, genocide took place once again, this time in Darfur, Sudan. The government-backed militia, the *Janjaweed*, destroyed properties, homes and communities. Rape has been used indiscriminately and approximately 400,000 men, women and children have been murdered. Tension still rages in the region and one-third of Darfur's population remain reliant on international aid. The International Criminal Court has issued two arrest warrants for Sudan's President on counts of Crimes Against Humanity. To date, these warrants remain outstanding.
