### **Application for the post of Personal Assistant**

#### **Application Process**

We will select people to interview using the detailed information provided in your application form. It is therefore important you demonstrate your ability to undertake the role by providing evidence against the person specification (job description and person specification available to download from our website <http://www.hmd.org.uk/about/vacancies>).

The interview process will be a two-tiered process. The first interviews and skills testing are scheduled to take place on Monday 9 May 2011 with a second interview for shortlisted candidates on Wednesday 11 May 2011. All short-listed applicants will be notified of first interviews by 5pm on Thursday 5 May 2011. If you do not receive an invitation to interview by the above time, regrettably, you should assume that you have not been successful on this occasion.
