

Hidden Histories Challenge terms and conditions

The Promoter is Holocaust Memorial Day Trust, PO Box 61074, London, SE1P 5BX.

1. By submitting examples of the work that has been produced during your hidden histories lessons you, (as the “Qualifying Leader of the Group”) agree to the following terms and conditions:
2. It is your responsibility, as the Qualifying Leader of the Group to get the necessary permissions from the individuals before submitting any work produced during your hidden histories lesson. Necessary permissions may include obtaining the consent of a parent or legal guardian prior to entry. The Promoter reserves the right to ask for evidence of that consent in writing at any time.
3. All work received by the Promoter before 6 December 2010 (“the Closing Date”) will be automatically entered into the draw. Work should be submitted either as photographs or as files on a USB stick.
4. Entries must be received by the Closing Date. Late entries will not be accepted.
5. The Promoter accepts no responsibility for entries which are lost or corrupted during transit.
6. There is no limit to the number of examples each Qualifying Leader of the Group can submit.
7. By submitting work produced during your activity, you are confirming that you have the express consent of all individuals involved in producing the work and in doing so, that the work submitted can be used by the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust for marketing and PR purposes.
8. The Promoter reserves the right to disqualify any work submitted which in its sole opinion it deems to be obscene or offensive in any way.
9. The entries will be reviewed by the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust, where possible, in consultation with the individual survivors whose stories feature in the hidden histories project.

10. All pieces of work submitted will be reviewed according to creativity, originality and appropriateness. Entries will be reviewed in categories according to which survivor story they are based upon.
11. The decision is final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into.
12. The winning entrants will be notified by email within 14 days of the Closing Date.
13. The Holocaust Memorial Day Trust cannot guarantee that the survivor will be able to attend the school or other location in person. Wherever possible, this will be arranged. If it is not possible, other arrangements to recognise the winning entrants will be made.
14. The winning schools or organisations may be required to participate in publicity and promotional activities.
