The Translator is the testimony of Daoud Hari, a Darfuri survivor who now lives in the U.S. His book tells of the destruction of his village, his subsequent work in helping refugees fleeing the genocide and in helping journalists from across the world enter into Darfur to report on the genocide.

About the author

Daoud Hari is a survivor of the genocide in Darfur. The speaker of Zaghawa, Arabic and English, he was able to use his language skills to help tell the world about the genocide in Darfur, which continues to date. Daoud was imprisoned by Sudanese forces along with an American journalist. Daoud now lives in Baltimore.
